The Position

All units are staffed by a multi-disciplinary team made up of Psychiatrists, Medical Officers, Nursing staff, Occupational Therapists, Carer & Consumer roles and Social Workers, incorporating aspects of the Safewards model utilising the associated interventions.

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

Key Responsibilities

- Assist in the planning, delivery and evaluation of high-quality nursing care in partnership with patients, infants, families and the multidisciplinary team.
- Provide safe, person-centred and family-focused care that supports both parental mental health recovery and infant wellbeing.
- Promote and support positive parent-infant relationships through attachment-focused and developmentally informed nursing practice.
- Undertake comprehensive mental health, psychosocial, physical health and risk assessments to contribute to individualised treatment and recovery planning.
- Monitor and support infant wellbeing, development and the parent-infant relationship, escalating concerns as appropriate.
- Provide education, support and guidance to patients and their families regarding mental health, infant care, parenting and recovery.
- Communicate effectively with patients, families, carers and members of the multidisciplinary team to ensure coordinated and collaborative care.
- Identify and escalate relevant clinical issues, risks or concerns to the Senior Nurse on duty and/or appropriate members of the healthcare team.
- Provide leadership and act as a positive role model, supporting the learning and development of graduate nurses, undergraduate nursing students and less experienced staff.
- Participate in multidisciplinary reviews, clinical handover, care planning and discharge planning processes.
- Maintain accurate, timely and comprehensive clinical documentation in accordance with professional, legislative and organisational requirements.
- Contribute to a culture of reflective practice, continuous improvement and recovery-oriented care within the Parent Infant Unit
- Maintain and develop specialist knowledge and skills in perinatal and infant mental health through participation in professional development, clinical supervision, reflective practice and ongoing learning opportunities.

Key Selection Criteria

Essential

1. Knowledge of the Mental Health and Wellbeing Act 2022, the Child Youth and Family Act 2005 and other relevant legislation
2. Proven ability to liaise and consult with relevant family members, team members and a broad range of health professionals and community agencies
3. Well-developed verbal, written, interpersonal, communication and computer literacy skills and knowledge
4. Demonstrated evidence of and a commitment to ongoing professional development and compliance with all Bendigo Health mandatory training requirements
5. Postgraduate qualification in Mental Health Nursing, Perinatal and Infant Mental Health or a related field, or a demonstrated commitment to undertaking further postgraduate study.
6. A willingness to learn and flexibility to operate in an environment of change and continuous improvement

Desirable

7. Awareness and understanding of the Safewards model and applying this to practice
