About the Course

If you have a passion for acute care nursing and a particular specialty with acute care then this is the course for you!

Undertaking post graduate studies in acute care (medical or surgical with further specialisation) will enable you to enhance your theoretical knowledge base and clinical patient care skills in a supported environment

- The course is facilitated in conjunction with LaTrobe University and begins in late February each year
- You will enroll in the Masters of Nursing (Acute Care) and then choose your exit point
- You will need to ensure that you are working at least 0.6 EFT in acute care setting. Hours outside this will be discussed on an individual basis.
- Depending on the stream you enroll in, content delivery is with LaTrobe University School of Rural
 Nursing, or via a blended model with some content provided by Bendigo Health and the remainder of
 your subjects with LaTrobe University. The Bendigo Health content is a blend of face to face and online
 content.
